ORDER TO APPEAR

This matter is before the Court on remand from the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals. In an order issued December 28, 2017, the Sixth Circuit stayed this Court's injunction for thirty days and remanded the matter "for the limited purpose of modifying the injunctive relief granted ... to provide direction to the State as to the type of process required to comply with the court's order." (ECF No. 30.)

To be clear, in its December 14, 2017 decision, this Court intended to enjoin Defendant from suspending any further driver's licenses of individuals *because of* their inability to pay their traffic debt *until* the State: (1) provides drivers a hearing where they have the opportunity to demonstrate their inability to pay; (2) provides

reasonable notice to drivers of the hearing; **and** (3) institutes alternatives to full payment for those unable to pay (e.g., realistic payment plans or volunteer service).

At a hearing in Courtroom # 242 of the **Theodore Levin Courthouse**, 231 West Lafayette Blvd., Detroit, MI 48226, on Wednesday, January 17, 2018 at 10:00 a.m., the parties may raise any questions or concerns they have regarding the Court's intended modification of the injunctive relief. At that time, Defendant shall be prepared to inform opposing counsel and the Court of how the State intends to satisfy the Court's injunction.
